NMSI PURPOSE

The National Migrant Scholars Internship (NMSI) initiative is a project sponsored by:

The College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) is an educational program that offers individuals with migrant or seasonal farm work backgrounds, a unique opportunity to begin an undergraduate program in an institution of higher learning.

This initiative is designed to encourage and support CAMP students in finding experiential learning opportunities that help them prepare for their career.



NMSI CAMP Student Requirements:

- Must be in good academic standing in a USDE recognized CAMP project.
- Must have a minimum 2.5 GPA.
- Must submit revised and completed application with supporting documents.
- Must complete all tasks assigned by NMSI Initiative staff.

Application Packet must Include:

- NMSI Application
- Resume
- Biography and professional photo
- College Transcript

Application Process:

- Application packet must be reviewed by a CAMP staff at their respective institution.
- CAMP staff must then electronically submit applicants packet via email.

WHAT IS CAMP?

College Assistance Migrant Program

- There are about 50 CAMP projects nationwide.
- Funded by the U.S. Department of Education.
- CAMP assists students who are migratory or seasonal farmworkers (or children of such workers) enrolled in their first year of undergraduate studies.
- Combined CAMP projects serve approximately 2000 students annually.
- CAMP assists students in their first year of college with academic, personal, and financial support.

Overall, nearly three-quarters of all CAMP students graduate with baccalaureate degrees.
