learn something new, maybe you will not be able to look at something, or you get chills. For me one of those moments was looking at a KKK mask. Knowing what this group had done to innocent civilians gave me the chills to see a real KKK mask.

Moving on from these floors, something so cool, and the exhibition I was looking most forward to as a huge Marvel fan, was seeing the original Black Panther suit worn by Chadwick Boseman.

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As you move onto the upper levels, you have different exhibitions.



An example of some would be the Musical Crossroads, where they have multiple costumes of musicians that have been worn. There were many different costumes from Michael

Jackson, The Jackson 5, Whitney Houston, Kenny Clarke and so many more. They as well had two such iconic objects, Chuck Berry's Cadillac which was used on stage in the documentary,

Another bright and early day with CHCI. We were all going to do a ropes course.






